

Achievement

Strengths:

- (KS2) Pupil Premium Achievement
- (KS2) Increase in children achieving the expected standard in Maths, highest for 4 years (84%)
- (KS2) Writing maintained from 2018, also highest for 4 years (87%)
- (KS2) Greater Depth in Reading, Writing and Maths all maintained or increased on 2018
- (KS1) Attainment at EXP is above LA for all subjects and combined (R,W,M) above LA (77% vs 70%)
- (KS1) Girls achievement is particularly strong in KS1 against national
- Phonics was 84% and in line with LA and above national (82%)
- EYFS highest GLD in 3 years 80%, vs LA 77% and National of 72%

Maintaining new approaches to spelling with a continual focus on this through teaching, learning and classroom environments.


