The stone-age period is said to have started around 3 million year ago when humans started to live in Europe. The stone-age was followed by the bronze-age period. This is when humans started to use metal. The bronze-age was followed by the iron-age when tools and weapons became more advanced and were used for farming. During the Palaeolithic Age (Old Stone Age), man gathered food by hunting wild animals and birds, fishing, and collecting fruits and nuts. During the Neolithic Age (towards end of the Stone Age), the humans formed settled communities, and domesticated plants and animals for the first time in history.
