
St. Mary's Mail

first tournament earlier in the month.

Homework

As you are aware, since returning to school in September, the children have not had a weekly homework task to complete. During this time families have had the opportunity to develop routines around regular spelling and times tables practice and reading x5 per week. This has also given us time to engage in research around homework and reflect on how we want homework to look at St Mary's.

Some findings from the EEF research:

- Homework is most effective when it is linked to learning in class.
- Quality of task is more important than quantity of tasks
- Homework can boots progress by 3-5 months.
- Homework in the primary setting will help prepare children for secondary school.

Today, children between Y1 and Y6 will be coming home with a homework book. Inside you will find a short English or Topic activity and a maths activity. The sheet will say times tables the class are currently focusing on and the spellings they will need to learn during the week.

Below you find some key information:

- Homework across the school will be set on Fridays and will be due in on Wednesdays.
- Homework sheets will look the same across this school . This will mean that siblings feel as though they have similar homework although the tasks themselves will look different depending on the age of the child.
- The homework task shouldn't take longer than 30minutes. But what a child can produce in 30 minutes will of course look different depending on their age.
- The hub will be open on Tuesdays after school for families wishing to complete homework in a quiet setting. Computers and other resources will be available. Children must be supervised by a parent.
- Inside the homework book you will see some expectations for children, teachers and parents. We ask that you familiarise yourself with this.
- In addition to the weekly homework task, children will still be expected to read x5 per week, and practise their spellings and tables throughout the week.
