### **Year 6 Learning Life Skills**

Our Year 6 children have already had a busy start to the term. Last Friday they visited the <u>Life Skills Centre</u> where they had the opportunity to take part in a variety of simulated activities. The activities show pupils that they should be taking personal responsibility for their own safety and help children learn how to assess risk and cope with difficult situations.



In addition to this, some year 6 children have started their Level 2 Bikeability training this week. At St Mary's we always make provision for all children to have this opportunity however this year we have only had enough interest to run one course. This is something to keep in mind as you approach year 6.



### **Social Justice**

This term the our whole school Global Theme is Social Justice. Children will be developing a commitment to social justice and equality.

In **KS1** children will be comparing life in an area of Uganda to their own locality. They will explore some of the characteristics of this African country as well as consider what it is like for a child attending school in a Ugandan town. The KS1 children will then look at what it was like to attend British schools in the Victorian era and will learn about the good work carried out by Mary Carpenter when establishing the Ragged schools.

In **LKS2** (Lower Key Stage two—Y3/4) children will be learning about how civilisation changed between early Stone Age and the Iron Age. They will develop an understanding of the move from a nomadic, hunter-gather life to the establishment of settlements and farming. They will then look at the lives of modern Inuit communities and compare life in a Tundra Biome to living in our locality.

In **UKS2** (Upper Key Stage 2-Y5/6) children will be learning about social reform in the Victorian era. Through their geography studies, they will consider how Yate changed during this time and look at the impact of the railway as well as learn more about local Victorian buildings such as the workhouse.

From learning from the past, our locality and life in other countries, the children will move on to considering how they can be changemakers for social justice. We will be sharing more on this in our future newsletters and on Class Dojo.
