Welcome back to term 5! We have been back in school for two weeks now but this is the first time I have had the opportunity to write to you.

The children have settled back to their learning remarkably well following the Easter break and the teachers have relished the opportunity to start a new term relatively normally!

Across the school this term our connected curriculum follows the theme Global Neighbours. Our oldest learners will be considering the question 'Can trade be a force for good?'. They will be looking at the impact of trade across the world with a focus on China and the silk trade.

In years 3 and 4 the children will be asking 'What will our footprint be?'. They have been learning about dinosaurs and what led to their extinction and will move on to exploring the human impact on birds— the 6th extinction.

Year 1 and 2's key question is 'Why go exploring?' They will learn about Brunel and the impact his work had on Bristol's landscape and look at the impact his inventions had on exploration.
